

## MINUTES-OF-THE-MEETING MONDAY 17 JULY 2023

### GUEST SPEAKER (Guest Speaker Co-ordinator – Robyn Watts)

Robyn introduced Graeme Sims, who has been a previous speaker at our club and now had the very interesting topic of Sydney Icon and, at times, trouble-maker, Beatrice Miles (Bea Miles).

#### Bea Miles: An Aussie Free Spirit



Graeme Sims recounted Bea Miles' story, including his personal encounters with her, and with unique input from her nearly 90-year-old Great Niece Gabrielle, whom he met and interviewed and who still lives in the original family home called "Ambleside" which still exists in Ashfield.

From the mid 1920's until her death in 1973, Beatrice (Bea) Miles was Sydney's best known and unforgettable eccentric, wandering the streets of Sydney and, when she felt like it, the bane of taxi drivers, bus and tram drivers and conductors. She was a remarkable, intelligent woman of prodigious knowledge and memory but of volatile and erratic behaviour. Graeme gave a stirring talk on the one and only Bea Miles.

Robyn thanked Graeme for his quirky and at times funny and sad tale of Bea Miles.
